'No Smartphone' Voluntary Code

Bennettsbridge National School

Aims:

- 1. As a parent body, to discourage pupils from having ownership of a <u>personal</u> smartphone up to and including 6th class.
- 2. To support and enable parents and guardians who are concerned about the detrimental effects of personal smartphones on their child(ren) to make a decision and implement it collectively.

Key Points:

- 1. The voluntary code does NOT include regular mobile phones (dumbphones) with no internet access.
- 2. It recognizes that every family has different priorities and opinions in relation to internet access and smartphone use.
- 3. It is an OPTION for ALL parents/guardians in the school.
- 4. If a parent/guardian alters their view subsequently and wants to purchase a personal smartphone for their child(ren) they can do so at any stage.
- 5. It is not a solution in itself to the growing problem but it is potentially one tool which may be helpful to those who wish to avail of it

e.g. if a child returns from school claiming that everyone in their class has a phone except them – any parent who wishes will be able to state clearly that one a certain proportion of the class have smartphones and the remainder will not be getting them until they have left primary school.

Implementation:

- A parent/guardian can choose VOLUNTARILY to complete an online form with a statement such as
 - "I/We as the parent(s) or guardian(s) of a child or children in Bennettsbridge National School, agree to not permit my/our child(ren) to own a personal smartphone up to and including 6th class"
- 2. The form is completed anonymously
- 3. The results will be collated by class group as a percentage (e.g. 82% of Junior Infants class parents have opted into the 'No Smartphone' voluntary code.
